Registration Forms

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## **How to Register for Camp**

To register your child for summer camp, you must submit a registration form along with payment for each week your child plans to attend.

#### **Separate Forms**

There are now separate forms for members and non-members. If you are a member you will complete the membership form, if you are not a member you will complete the non-member form. Health care forms are the same for members and non-members. This change is to further organize the admission process.

#### **Registration Forms**

One registration form and one heath form is required to be completed for EACH child you are registering for camp. All sections of the registration form and health care form include ALL release signatures required for complete registration. Registration is not complete without payment and completed forms. A space for child will not be saved without complete registration. Please note when sending forms electronically: Signatures must be handwritten, digital signatures typed out on a computer or device will be considered invalid.

#### **Payment**

To complete registration, YOU MUST PAY THE FULL AMOUNT FOR EACH WEEK YOUR CHILD(REN) IS REGISTERED FOR CAMP. Card payments can be taken over the phone (936) 639-3466. The Naranjo Museum of Natural History accepts: Mastercard, Visa, Discover, cash, or checks made out to the Naranjo Museum of Natural History.

#### Where to Register:

You may register your child in person during normal museum hours (check our website www. naranjomuseum.org for our hours).

You can print a registration form online and submit it via email. This can be done by either scanning the registration form or taking a very clear photo of it using your smartphone. Most smartphones have a "files" app that allows you to scan documents and store them as a PDF file on your phone that you can then email.

#### **Cancellations/Refunds:**

Due to high demand for camp positions, there are no full refunds for completed registration. To receive a 50% refund, you need to email a cancellation request to info@naranjomuseum.org within 10 days prior to the starting day of your child's registered camp week. Refunds will not be given after 10 days.

#### **Camp Times**

#### **Camp Ages**

Your child must be at least 6 years old and be going into 1st-6th grade as of Fall 2023 to participate in Naranjo Museum Summer Camps. Camp weeks are separated by age groups (1st-3rd) or (4th - 6th) according to the grade they are entering in the fall. There are 20 camp positions available per week. Register early to ensure a place for your child.

#### Drop off/Pick up

Parents when dropping off campers and picking them up will need to sign in/out their child. If someone different is picking them up please inform the summer camp instructor.

# **Camp Descriptions**

#### STEAM Week (4th - 6th)

Science experiments, building, creative problem solving, and more! Campers will explore various areas of Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math!

#### **Dinosaur Discovery**

Campers will dive into the world of dinosaurs! They will learn the names of dinosaurs, what makes each one special and how scientists learn about dinosaurs. Campers will take part in fun crafts and activities that bring to dinos to life.

#### JR. Paleontologist


Campers will take part in dig simulations, will learn what skills paleontologists use to help find dinosaurs and how they know where to look. They will observe at the different groups of dinosaurs and how they are categorized. Campers will learn through crafts, team exercises, and games.

#### **Space Exploration**

Take off into space! Campers will explore outer space with different crafts and activities focusing on the planets, NASA, and more! Campers will play games, conduct space experiments, and mission simulations.

#### **All About Animals**

Campers will learn all about East Texas animals and how to take care of your pets through games, crafts, and group activities.

Morning Care and Afternoon Care is available for children who need to arrive before 10am and stay after 3pm to help parents who are working during times camp starts and ends. Campers will be cared for by camp staff. Campers may play games, watch a movie and socialize during morning and afternoon care.

#### **Morning Care**

For morning care, campers will check in and be in the classroom until 8:30am. Morning camp will take place in the classroom. Children will be able to play with toys provided by the museum or perosnal devices that they bring and a movie will be played.

#### **Afternoon Care**

For afternoon care, children will be in the classroom. Children will be able to play with toys/devices that they bring at their table and a movie will be played.

#### **Snacks**

**Snacks will no longer be provided by the camp.** Campers in the morning/afternoon care will need to bring their own snacks and drinks.

#### **FAQ for Morning and Afternoon Care**

#### Q: What if I only need morning/afternoon care for one day?

A: If you only need morning/afternoon care for one day, you must pay the price for the full week.

#### Q: If I am not pre-registered for the morning/afternoon care, can I add it on later?

A: Yes, as long as you can notify the Naranjo Museum and pay the price for care, no later than the Friday before your camp week starts.

#### Drop off/Sign in starting at 9:45am

Parents must walk their children inside of the building and sign their children in. Parents may not drop children off until sign-in is complete. Parents will need to provide the name of the person who will be picking up their child.

#### Pick up/Sign out 3:00pm

Campers must be picked up from the classroom. Camp staff will need to verify the person picking up matches the name given during drop off time. The person picking up the child may be asked to show their ID to verify identification. Unless you are registered for afternoon care, your child <u>MUST</u> be picked up no later than 3:15pm.

#### **Learning Sessions**

The sessions are when we do our main activities and focus our learning on the theme of the week. These sessions mainly focus on one activity such as a craft, exploring the museum, discussion, games, etc.

#### Free Time

Lunch time runs straight into free time everyday. Free time is a 30 minute period where campers get a break from learning and have time to do something of their choosing such as: socializing with other campers, coloring, free drawing, water color painting, play board games, play with toys, play on their devices they brought, etc.

#### **Camp Supervision:**

Camps are instructed and supervised by qualified staff and volunteers. All museum staff and volunteers have been through extensive background checks and training.

#### **Check in/Check out:**

See sign in/sign out page.

#### Lunch:

Parents need to pack their children a sack lunch, a couple of snacks and plenty of water. If your child does not have lunch, the parent is responsible for bringing the child a lunch to the museum by 11:45am. Lunches brought to children will need to be dropped off in the ticket office.

#### **Clothing:**

Campers are asked to wear comfortable clothes and shoes that can get messy. Closed-toe shoes are recommended for outside play.

#### **Toys/Electronics:**

Toys and electronics are permitted for children to use during free time or before/after care. The Naranjo Museum and staff are not responsible for any loss or damages to anything sent with your child.

#### **Outside Play:**

Campers are taken outside at the beginning of camp. Temperatures are closely monitored and children are not taken outside during particularly hot days. Children are encouraged to wear sun screen to protect their skin from the sun.

#### **Cancellation Policy:**

Due to high demand for camp positions, there are no full refunds for completed camp registration. To receive a 50% refund, you need to email a cancellation request to info@ naranjomuseum.org 10 days prior to the starting date of your camp week. Refunds will no be given after 10 days.

#### **Medical Policy:**

Museum staff are only permitted to administer basic first aid. Parents will be called should children feel ill, running a fever or vomiting and will be asked to be picked up. In the event of a medical emergency, assistance may be called from A Pineywoods Home Health Care (next door to the museum). If necessary, 911 will be called and the first response will take children to the closest hospital. At the time, we are unable to accommodate children with special medical, behavioral and/or mental needs.

#### **Camp rules/Discipline Policy:**

Camp rules are explained the first day of camp and are gone over throughout the week.

#### **Camp Rules:**

- 1. Be respectful to the teacher, assistants, museum visitors, etc
- 2. Be respectufl to the museum and its property
- 3. Be respectful to each other and each other's property
- 4. Participate in activities
- 5. HAVE FUN!!

Camp rules are explained with an emphasis on choices and communication. The child will be given a verbal warning about their poor choice and reminded of camp rules. A second time, the child will be separated and given time out (the amount of their age) to reflect on their choices. Should a child's choices cause continued disruption or harm to the other campers, teachers, or museum you will be asked to pick up your child early. You may bring your child back the following day; however, if a camper's choices compromise the safety and well-being of the other campers, etc. your child will be asked not to return.

#### There are no refunds for camper dismissal as a result of poor behavior.

There are not enough camp staff to care for campers one-on-one. If you have questions regarding behavioral expectations after reading camp information, please contact Chloe Morrell at chloe@naranjomuseum.org.

# **Frequently Asked Questions**

#### Q: How can I guarantee my child gets into the camp they want?

A: There are limited camp weeks and camp spots (20 campers per week). To guarantee your child gets into camp, register them as soon as possible. Museum Members can register 2 weeks before the information is released to the public.

#### Q: Can I bring lunch to my child? Can I stay and eat lunch with them?

A: Yes, but the lunch will need to be left at the ticket office not later than 11:45am. Parents are not permitted.

#### Q: How do I contact my child during camp?

A: You should first call (936) 639 -3466 to get in touch with the museum who will inform camp teachers.

#### Q: Can I come to camp to give my child needed medication?

A: Absolutely, as we are not allowed to administer medication to children, you are welcome to come and give your child medicine. Please inform us of the schedule on the health care form or for unscheduled medicine, call the museum ahead of time. We will bring the camper to you, please do not enter the classroom.

#### Q: Are movies shown at camp? How are movies selected?

A: Movies are mostly shown during morning drop off times and lunch. Movies are not shown during instructional times. Movies are selected based on relevance to the week's topic and viewing age group.

#### Q: Are all the weeks different?

A: Camp weeks with the same age group and theme have the same activities.
