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How to Register for Camp

To register your child for summer camp, you must submit a registration form along with payment for each week your child plans to attend.

Separate Forms

There are separate forms for non-members, members and VIP-members. If you are a member you will complete the membership form, if you are not a member, you will complete the non-member form. **Health forms are required for each camper and are located on the last page of this packet.**

Registration Forms

One registration form and one health form is required to be completed for **EACH** child you are registering for camp. All sections of the registration forms and Health form; this includes **ALL** release signatures are required for registration. **Registration is not complete without payment and completed forms. Your child's camp place will not be saved without complete registration. Please note when sending forms electronically: Signatures must be handwritten, digital signatures typed out on a computer or device will be considered invalid.**

Payment

To complete registration, **YOU MUST PAY THE FULL AMOUNT FOR EACH WEEK YOUR CHILD(REN) IS REGISTERED FOR CAMP.** Card payments can be taken over the phone (936)-639-3466. The Naranjo Museum of Natural History accepts: Mastercard, Visa, Discover, cash, or checks made out to the Naranjo Museum of Natural History.

Where to Register:

You may register your child in person (check our website www.naranjomuseum.org for our hours).

You can print off a registration form online and submit it via email. This can be done by either scanning the registration form or taking a very clear photo of it using your smartphone. Most smartphones have a “files” app that allows you to scan documents and store them as a PDF file on your phone that you can then email.

Cancellations/Refunds:

Due to high demand for camp positions, **there are no full refunds for completed registration. To receive a 50% refund**, you need to email a cancellation request to info@www.naranjomuseum.org **10 days or more before the starting date of your child’s registered camp week. You will not receive a refund if you cancel less than 10 days before the starting date of your child’s registered camp week.**

Camp Ages

Your child must be at least 5 years old to participate in Naranjo Museum Summer Camps. Camp weeks are separated by age groups **(5yrs-8yrs)** or **(9yrs-13yrs)** according to their age in May 2026. There are 30 camp positions available per session (morning and afternoon) per week. Register early to ensure a place for your child.

Drop off/Pick up

Parents when dropping off campers and picking them up will need to sign in/out their child. If someone different is picking them up please inform the summer camp instructor.

Camp Descriptions

****Parents please note when signing children up for multiple weeks that camp weeks alternate between 5yrs-8yrs and 9yrs-13yrs.****

Week 1 June 1st- 5th

Jurassic Week! (5yrs-8yrs Only): “Jurassic” is one of those words that instantly sparks excitement—kids hear it and immediately picture towering dinosaurs and epic adventures. During this week, campers delve into the Jurassic period, a time when enormous and extraordinary creatures ruled the Earth. They’ll explore what different dinosaurs ate, how they hunted, and what scientists think they may have looked like. Campers are in for a week packed with dinosaur discoveries, hands-on exploration, and big-*imagination* fun.

Week 2 June 8st- 12th

When Worlds Changed: Extinction & Survival (9yrs-13yrs): Campers will launch into a high-stakes survival adventure through Earth’s most extreme events! From ancient oceans filled with otherworldly creatures to the colossal asteroid impact that ended the age of dinosaurs, explorers will discover the powerful forces that changed our planet forever. Through hands-on challenges and thrilling experiments, campers will investigate erupting volcanoes, planet-freezing ice ages, blazing hot climates, and massive extinction events. Along the way, they’ll uncover how some species vanished while others adapted, evolved, and became the ultimate survivors. Get ready to think like a scientist, build like an engineer, and survive like a prehistoric pro!!

Week 3 June 15st- 19th

Build It! (5yrs-8yrs): A hands-on celebration of creativity, tinkering, and invention. Formerly known as Tinker Week during spring camp, this revamped summer version brings brand-new projects and challenges for campers to explore. Kids dive into STEAM concepts as they design, experiment, and build everything from simple robots to imaginative inventions of their own creation. It's a week packed with problem-solving, teamwork, and the thrill of turning ideas into real, working creations—bigger and better than ever.

Week 4 June 22nd- 26th

Fossil Finders (9yrs-13yrs): Fossil Finders brings new life to our classic Jr. Paleontologist camp with an extra dash of adventure. Inspired by the spirit of Indiana Jones, this revamped week is designed for curious minds and future scientists, this immersive week invites campers to step into the boots of modern explorers as they learn authentic excavation techniques, analyze fossil evidence, and investigate some of the newest dinosaur discoveries happening around the globe.

Week 5 July 6th- 10th

Worlds Beneath the Waves (5yrs-8yrs): Journey through Earth's deepest and most mysterious frontier: the oceans. The adventure begins in the Cambrian period, when life first exploded in the seas with strange and spectacular creatures unlike anything alive today. As the week unfolds, campers will explore the rise of ancient marine giants—from swift mosasaurs ruling prehistoric waters to the massive whales that live in modern oceans. We'll shell-abrate the wonders of the ocean through interactive learning, creative crafts, and exciting marine science activities that will keep curiosity afloat all week long.

Week 6 July 13th- 17th

Rockets to Rovers (9yrs-13yrs): This week is an exciting new take on our classic space-themed week, designed to launch campers into the wonders of exploration beyond Earth. Kids will dive into the history and future of space travel as they learn about NASA's missions and the bold new players shaping today's space race, including SpaceX and Blue Origin. Along the way, they'll explore exciting activities from rockets to rovers

Week 7 July 20th- 24th

Castles, Kingdoms, & Culture (5yrs-8yrs): Campers won't just learn about the Middle Ages—they'll live it. Throughout Castles, Kingdoms, & Culture, kids will build their own miniature castles, design personal crests, and experiment with the colorful artistry of stained-glass-style window making. They'll even engineer simple siege machines to understand how medieval battles were fought. It's a hands-on journey into a world of knights, empires, and epic stories brought to life through creativity and exploration.

Week 8 July 27th- 31st

Jr. Archeologist of East Texas (9yrs-13yrs): Jr. Archaeologist of East Texas invite campers to dig into history—from iconic sites like Stonehenge and the Egyptian pyramids to real archaeological discoveries right here in East Texas. Throughout the week, campers gain hands-on experience with excavation techniques, artifact analysis, and they'll practice skills such as mapping, participate in mock digs, and explore the tools used in modern archaeology.

Parents must walk their children inside of the building and sign their children in. Parents may not drop children off until sign-in is complete. Parents will need to provide the name of the person who will be picking up their child.

Learning Sessions

The sessions are when we do our main activities and focus our learning on the theme of the week. These sessions mainly focus on one activity such as a craft, guided activity, exploring the museum, discussion, games, etc.

Snack Time

All students should bring a water bottle to camp as well as a snack for snack time. The museum will provide snacks each day of camp, but students may want to bring their own snack from home.

Camp Supervision:

Camps are instructed and supervised by qualified staff and volunteers. All museum staff and volunteers have been through extensive background checks and training.

Check in/Check out:

Lunch:

Lunch will not be provided. Campers participating in full day or have added on supervised lunch hour must bring their own lunch.

Clothing:

Campers are asked to wear comfortable clothes and shoes that can get messy. Closed-toe shoes are strongly recommended.

Toys/Electronics:

Toys and electronics are permitted for children to use ONLY during free time or before/after camp sessions. The Naranjo Museum and staff are not responsible for any loss or damages to anything sent with your child.

Outside Play:

Campers are taken outside for supervised playtime on the playground. Temperatures are

closely monitored and children are not taken outside during particularly hot days. Children are encouraged to wear sunscreen to protect their skin from the sun.

Cancellation Policy:

Due to high demand for camp positions, there are no full refunds for completed camp registration. To receive a 50% refund, you need to email a cancellation request to: info@naranjomuseum.org 10 days or more before the starting date of your camp week. You will not receive a refund if you cancel less than 10 days before the starting date of your camp week.

Medical Policy:

Museum staff are only permitted to administer basic first aid to children unless otherwise stated in the child's medical information on registration form. Parents will be called should children feel ill, children running fever or throwing up will be asked to be picked up. In the event of a medical emergency, assistance may be called from A Pineywoods Home Health Company (next door to the museum). If necessary, 911 will be called and the first response will take children to the closest hospital. At the time, we are unable to accommodate children with special medical, behavioral and/or mental needs.

Camp rules/Discipline Policy:

Camp rules are explained the first day of camp and are gone over throughout the week. **Camp Rules:**

1. Be respectful to each other and each other's property
2. Be respectful to the teacher, assistants, museum visitors, etc.
3. Be respectful to the museum and its property
4. Participate in activities
5. HAVE FUN!!

Camp rules are explained with an emphasis on choices and communication. The child will be given a verbal warning about their poor choice and reminded of camp rules, second time the child will be separated and given time (the amount of their age) to reflect on their choices. Should a child's choices cause continued disruption or harm to the other campers, you will be asked to pick up your child. You may bring your child back the following day, however if a camper's choices compromise the safety and well-being of the other campers, your child will be asked not to return. If your child does not choose to cause harm to other campers, but their behavioral patterns/choices continue to distract or disrupt campers or camp activities, you may be asked to pick up your child. **There are no refunds for camper dismissal as a result of poor behavior.**

There are not enough camp staff to care for campers one-on-one. If you have questions regarding behavioral expectations after reading camp information, please contact Erin Gentry at eringentry@naranjomuseum.org.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: How can I guarantee my child gets into the camp they want? *A: There are limited camp weeks and camp spots (20 campers per session). To guarantee your child gets into camp, register them as soon as possible. Museum Members can register 2 weeks before the information is released to the public.*

Q: How do I contact my child during camp?

A: You should first call (936)-639 -3466 to get in touch with the museum who will inform camp teachers.

Q: Can I come to camp to give my child needed medication? *A: Absolutely, as we are not allowed to administer medication to children, you are welcome to come and give your child medicine. Please inform us of the schedule on Health care form, or for unscheduled medicine call the museum ahead of time. We will bring the camper to you, please do not enter the classroom.*

Q: Are movies shown at camp? How are movies selected?

A: Movies are not shown during instructional times.

Q: Are all the weeks different?

A: Each themed camp week is different from the other themed camp weeks.

The student and the guardian acknowledge and agree that any photos, videos, pictorial images, voice recording, or quotations including those of student take or created by any Released Party (including without limitation any taken by any photographer or videographer paid by or volunteering for any Released Party) during or relating to the Camp are the sole property of the Naranjo Museum and may be used in future publications, web pages, promotions, advertisements and exhibits of the Naranjo Museum (or any other person authorized to use such images by the Naranjo Museum without the need of any additional permission from or consideration to the student or guardian. I release and waive for myself, the student and anyone claiming through us all claims based on the right of privacy, right of publicity, moral rights or any other intellectual property rights related to the rights granted by me to the Naranjo Museum.

I acknowledge that I have read ALL the information regarding the camps at the Naranjo Museum of Natural History. By signing this release and waiver I agree to follow the protocols set by the Naranjo Museum Summer Camps and the Naranjo Museum of Natural History.
